This term we have approached our support materials a little differently. The theme is 'respect' which is a value that can be explored across the whole curriculum. We have mapped out some ways in which exploring 'respect' could support spiritual, moral, social and cultural development.

Spiritual	Moral

Encouraging an atmosphere where everyone can take risks. Create a series of prayer spaces linked to the value of respect or valuing everyone.
