Dear friends

Sometimes it feels like nothing much has happened since the last prayer letter, well, nothing could be further from the truth this time around! There has been a whirlwind of change in such a short time that few of us have experienced before. I mentioned in January that there would be challenges ahead for 2020 but Covid-19 and all that came with it was far from what I was thinking. At the time of writing we are still in a period of lockdown and uncertainty for what lies ahead. For many even when things settle down it may take months if not years before a genuine recovery is felt particularly for business, trade and the economy and these could have a knock-on effect on charities such as ourselves.
