**Instructions for Good Samaritan story craft**

Colour the pictures then cut whole the square out.

Fold along the horizontal light dotted lines - one is a valley fold and the other a mountain fold as shown by the symbols. Secure at the edges with a small piece of tape so it does not unfold.

Cut along the four vertical cut lines as far as the scissor symbols to form three flaps that can be folded down later.

You can now begin to use it to re-tell the story.

Fold back each flap to reveal the answer to the question – “did they stop and help the man?”

When the flaps are all folded down you can read the end of the story and answer the question below.



A man set out along the road when he was attacked by robbers. They left him on the road badly beaten and almost dead.

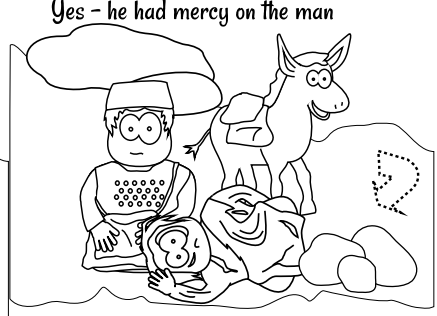

Yes - he had mercy on the man



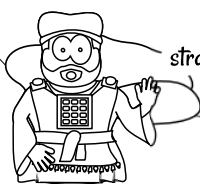
He treated his wounds
