REFLECTION IDEAS – BEING GENEROUS

Luke chapter 24 verses 1 to 4; Mark chapter 12 verses 41 to 44



Being generous to others, being happy to give time, money, food, kindness, a smile to others, can help shape our lives in a really positive way. As well as generosity being good for others, it can be good for our own well-being. Jesus encourages us to give generously, however small our resources may be.

The Bible passage in this video is a story that Jesus used to illustrate that, however small, the things that we give to others, material or otherwise, are important. Christians believe that the Bible also teaches that if we give generously we too will be blessed.

Reflection

- How do you feel when you are kind and generous to others? Can you think of a time when someone
 has been kind and generous to you?
- In what ways can you be generous to other people?
- St Francis of Assisi said 'It is in giving that we receive'. What does this mean?

Description


In the Bible, there are many examples of people being generous - The boy who gave his whole lunch that ended up feeding 5000 others (Matthew 14:14-21), the story in which a Samaritan man gave his time and resources to a victim of robbery (Luke 10:25-37) and the woman who gave two small copper coins which Jesus said was far more than others (Luke 21:1-4), just to name a few!

Christians believe that we need to be generous with our time, resources and money because that is what Jesus did and what he told others to do, when he walked on the Earth.




The Widow's Mite
