


Looking back at the spring term

This term we sent schools two **Connect videos** for use in their collective worship, class assemblies or RE lessons.

Life Lessons – Hope

In this video John Hardwick told the story of how Jesus healed a blind man called Bartimaeus, giving him hope and a future. We shared that Christians believe that we can all have hope in God and that he can give us a reason to hope even in the dark, difficult days, like a light shining in the darkness.





Using the story of the widow who gave her last coin to God we shared that it is good to be generous with our resources; our time, our energy or our money. Children from a local primary school recorded their definitions of 'being generous' in the form of a 'Vox Pop', and Jimmy and Joe, our puppet friends, also shared their thoughts about giving their time to others even when it's hard to do.

Easter Presentation – Love

It was good to visit schools again this term and share the Easter story with an emphasis on how Jesus died in our place because he loves us. Assembly teams were booked to visit 74 schools although a few had to be cancelled due to Covid-19 cases, both within team members and in the schools. At Easter, just as at Christmas, we produced a video of the presentation so that no school missed out. It was a joy to be out on tour again. The lovely faces of the children bring the whole assembly to life. We had a warm welcome from everyone even if the last

day was far from warm - performing in the playground in a windy eight degrees was unforgettable!! Linda Hardy It was a joy (albeit tinged with nervousness) to be back visiting schools in person. At the first school our stage was the playground – but the sun shone on us at 9:10 on 21 March. Our last day also saw us sharing the presentation outside – and in the space of three weeks the seasons had changed; we held onto our puppet theatre as well as our hats – in the cold wind - but it did not deter our delight in being able to visit the school again, nor the children's as they laughed at the puppets and sang with us. In summing up, this tour was indeed very welcome and a very poignant one for me personally - 15 schools where children heard of how Barabbas was given a second chance and that every child is a child of God. Inspire Prayer Spaces

Siân produced three **Reflect videos** in the spring, with short thoughts and activities entitled At the mountain top, Letting Go, and That's not fair. These videos have become central to our support of collective worship in schools and continue to elicit encouraging feedback from teachers. A further video - Hope in Brokenness - was produced after a request from a school to respond specifically to current world events. This video was quickly recorded and edited at the beginning of March and offers a short encouraging reflection for children that even when things seem broken, there is always hope.



Easter Prayer bags - In March 648 children in nine primary schools across Cambridgeshire received an individual drawstring bag containing the items needed for six prayer space activities all linked to the events of Easter: joy, friendship, forgiveness, hope, serving others and our unique gifts and talents. The activities allowed children the chance to reflect, think about and explore Easter further and why these events mean so much to Christians today. These bags, which link to the RE curriculum around the life of Jesus, were offered to children in KS2 (aged 7-11) and feedback afterwards shows they really helped to 'focus our thoughts on Easter'. Thank you to all those involved in sewing, packing and delivering these bags – it truly was a joint effort!

He has talked so much about the games... he has also remembered lots of the teaching - explaining how Jesus is the light of the world who can stop us from stumbling. We have both been blown away by the extraordinarily high level of care, effort and love that went into the weekend. The whole way home my child and two friends just talked about all the fun and highlights from each day. They loved it all. The activities give the children an opportunity to reflect on their time at primary school and challenge them to think about upcoming changes as they move onto secondary school. It's Your Move – a team is being gathered to visit schools and give reassurance to Year 6 student as they move schools. Summer assembly tour – teams are currently rehearsing and booking for our tour entitled *Forgiving Isn't Easy*.
