What a privilege to be back in schools! And what a welcome we have had... 'It's great to see you again', 'we have missed you', 'the children think you are film stars' (in reference to videos we have been producing), 'I can't believe you're here in person!' are just some of the many comments we have had since being back in schools with our Advent and Easter assembly tours. As one team member commented: the headteacher of one of the schools was almost overwhelmingly pleased to see us again!

With two years having passed since our last visits it's fair to say some of us wondered whether anyone would remember us! Any fears were soon eased and if anything, we felt our relationships with many schools had strengthened, there was more than one comment that expressed we have missed you because you are part of our school community. This did much to warm our hearts.

Whilst putting a video together some time ago, one of our volunteers commented that for hundreds of children GenR8 is part of their primary school experience. I think recent encounters have strengthened that feeling. How amazing is that! For many of the team encounters with young people and adults in shops, on the street, even whilst overseas, who remember GenR8 positively brings such encouragement. Just this week a former GenR8 team member emailed to say: '*At a business award recently I was on a table with a local cinema team and a young apprentice who had been nominated. None of us won awards but all those in their 20s remembered me from GenR8. It was a bit of a sight with the entire table doing the GenR8 waves!'* For many their faith journey has been inspired through the work of GenR8 and we are privileged to play a small part in building God's Kingdom.
