Looking back at the spring term

We are excited to report back on another busy term, with a new term in full swing with lots happening – I hope you enjoy catching up with our news.

Easter Assembly - Forgiveness and saying sorry

The Easter presentation was taken into 114 schools and the reception was overwhelmingly positive. The Bible focus was on Jesus' tomb, where frightened soldiers recognised that even they would be forgiven if they



were truly sorry. The puppets discovered the importance of forgiving friends and the song by John Hardwick shared a verse from the Bible – Be Kind and Compassionate to one another; forgive each other just as in Christ God forgave you – Ephesians 4: 32. The assembly ended with a reflection on the things we may all need to say sorry for – being angry, deflecting blame onto others, not sharing, saying mean things, and choosing not to help someone in need. Receiving feedback from several schools was really brilliant - Thank you to the team, the children and staff thoroughly enjoyed the assembly, as always. - When the children were told that you were coming there was a loud cheer!!!

Siân – Commissioning Service

Siân Thorne was commissioned in her new role as GenR8 Director at Christ Church Trumpington, her home church, on Sunday 2 April. GenR8 team members, family and friends attended the service where Liz Jenkin, Chair of GenR8 trustees, shared a bit about GenR8 and reflected on Siân's journey, first as Inspire Prayer Spaces Director, and now as overall Director of the charity.

Siân says: 'Thank you very much to all those that sent messages beforehand, prayed for me and/or came to support the service. I felt really blessed and upheld in

prayer. It was also a brilliant opportunity to share my role in GenR8 with my own church family and has since sparked many conversations about the work we do and how GenR8, local churches, and schools, work together.'



Inspire Prayer Spaces

Spring term saw two IPS days, in Steeple Morden and Alconbury, supported by their local churches. The theme for Steeple Morden was 'me, my community and the wider world' and at the end of the session one child exclaimed 'I'm going to make a space like this in my bedroom when I get home'! The day at Alconbury, hosted by the church of St Peter and St Paul, was on the theme of Easter. It had been rearranged from earlier in the term and it was so encouraging to have the support from members of the church and a visit from one of the co-

headteachers who was not 'at work' that particular day!

We also took Inspire Prayer Spaces to Make Lunch Royston in February half term. It was a new experience to be in a nonschool setting, where the



children stayed and explored the prayer activities with their families. Our visit was so successful that plans are already afoot to visit Make Lunch Royston again!

Xcellr8 – Anticip8

A full capacity of 48 children descended on Histon Baptist Church for our February Xcellr8 weekend for children aged 8-11. An exciting weekend was enjoyed by team and children alike and amongst the fun, games, and general mayhem our 'Anticip8' theme explored what Christians are looking forward to and what our Christian hope is founded upon. In the space of two packed days, we managed to look at the Old Testament prophets, parables, the kingdom of God, Jesus' resurrection and the Holy Spirit! Phew!

One parent got in touch to say: 'Our son had a brilliant time, enjoying the whole weekend and inspired to spend more time praying and deepening his relationship with God. He is very keen

to return next year and invite friends too.'

Looking ahead

Summer term assembly – We can make a difference

Preparations are being made for the summer assembly presentation, that focuses on how we can all make a big difference by loving our neighbours as Jesus taught. This term we have fewer team members available, with some regulars being unable to join us, meaning that teams are small. It will be a challenge but we trust that our God provides; we know the task to reach young people with a Christian message is a vital one and one that we are called to. Inspire Prayer Spaces this term

IPS days are booked at Longstanton on 18 May, Whittlesford on 25 May and Barton Primary on 7 June. On each day we will bring a range of different activities to the school, transforming a space into a sanctuary of calm. Children work through the activities in groups of three and are encouraged to reflect and think about themselves, their local community and the wider world. Each activity ends with an invitation to pray and talk to God.

Permanent Prayer Spaces

The theme in the 10 schools is currently 'Let's Celebrate!'. We have linked this with the coronation of King Charles III and it encourages children to remember all the times they have celebrated - writing these days down on balloon shapes - for everyone else to see. The next theme, just after half term, is 'growing and changing'. This final prayer space activity of the academic year will focus on transition – the moving onto different schools, teachers, or year groups, that every child will experience. This change can be unsettling for many children and the PS provides the opportunity to think about and reflect on their feelings.
