Here is a snapshot of four of our different programmes last term.

Christmas Assembly - Christmas Hope

Five GenR8 teams visited schools in late November and December with an assembly called 'Christmas Hope' by Gail Featherstone.



The assembly, that shared the good news that God's son was born as a baby to bring hope to the world, was given a great reception in schools by children and staff alike. The assembly included: puppets discussing their roles in the school nativity; a mini-nativity play from the perspective of the angels; a song — 'The Angels Say' by Fischy Music; and a time of reflection. We presented more than 120 Christmas assemblies in primary and first schools across Cambridgeshire, North Hertfordshire, and West Norfolk — how amazing that thousands of children in this region heard that Jesus is the hope of the world and what that can mean for us all.

Cool Choices

The Cool Choices team of Siân, Steve, Liz and Bev visited Year 6 classes in September and October with workshops about making good choices. This term four schools were visited in a partnership with Jenny from Actios in a partnership that has being really positive. The Cool Choices project is now well established in schools and has been running for 10 years. Penny Kite, trustee, who visited one of the sessions gave her perspective: I had never seen the programme and only had the vaguest idea what to expect. We were shown into a Year 6 classroom, where the teacher and the pupils sat expectantly. Frankly, I was astonished. The programme, designed to help pupils to consider how to make good decisions, neither preached nor cajoled. The GenR8 team accepted suggestions without any sign of concern, however difficult the subject matter that arose... Finally, reflection stations gave pupils the chance to think again about Cool Choices – ones that provide good outcomes for themselves, for others and for the world. Penny concluded: I was so proud to watch the team in action, amazed at the professional session that they had delivered, and profoundly thankful to God for the work of GenR8.

Inspire Prayer Spaces

In the autumn term the Inspire Prayer Spaces team have been to Guilden Morden and Kennett Primary Schools; for both this was their first prayer space experience and we are delighted that Guilden Morden have started a Permanent Prayer Space in response to the visit. We also had new opportunities in the form of two visits to Royston; to Make Lunch and to the Saturday Coffee Break at Royston Methodist Church. The latter was organised after a volunteer at the former was so impressed that they wanted to share it with their church! For those who do not know, Make Lunch is a programme that provides hot meals and activities in the holidays for children who normally receive free school

meals. The children at Make Lunch engaged well with the prayer spaces and at RMC there were positive and encouraging conversations about the work of GenR8 and prayer spaces in schools and a great response to the reflective activities.
