REFLECTION IDEAS



A New Start

Luke chapter 22 verses 54-62; John chapter 21

Christians believe that God sent Jesus into the world to show us how to live. He died and then came back to life again so that we can be forgiven when we say sorry for the things that we get wrong. The Bible story we use in this presentation is that of Peter, one of Jesus' disciples who denied even knowing Jesus three times; we read that Jesus loved Peter and was willing to forgive him, giving him a new start and an important job to do. Christians believe that God loves us all like that and does not give up on us – he is always willing to forgive us and give us a new start.

Reflection

- When have you made a new start? Examples might include a new school or club, or moving house
- Why did the puppet want to go to Timbuktu? Have you ever felt like that?
- What mistake did Peter make? Why did he do it? How did it make him feel when he realised?
- How does the story of Peter make you feel about saying sorry and forgiveness?
- Do you think it is easier to say sorry or to forgive?

Inspire Prayer Space Activity – A New Start

Equipment

White boards, white board pens, something to clean white boards

Description

Christians believe Jesus did something amazing when he died on the cross and came back to life at Easter. He gave us the chance to have a new start, by wiping out all the mistakes we make in our lives, just like the team wiped the bad words off the white board in the presentation.


- Write words or draw pictures of things that you might do wrong on your white board. You don't have to show these to anyone.
- Think about how you feel when you do these wrong things.
- Wipe the board clean and think about being forgiven for the bad things you have done, and having a new start.
- Write or draw some good and happy things on your board instead.

Peter had two names: Simon, his birth name, and Peter, the name that Jesus had given him. Peter means 'rock'.

Easter Poem

We used this Easter poem by Amy Scott Robinson. Children could choose one verse from the poem to create a collage or painting. Display each verse with the corresponding artwork around it.

- That first day, everything looked black. The friends of Jesus cried. They thought he'd gone forever the day that Jesus died.
- 2 He hung upon a cross and his friends all ran to hide they thought he'd gone forever the day that Jesus died.
- 3 They put him in a tomb and they sealed him tight inside they thought he'd gone forever the day that Jesus died.
- 4 But only three days later the tomb was opened wide when Jesus' friends arrived there, an angel stood inside!
- 5 Today the cross reminds us Not just how Jesus died But that he's alive forever And is always by our side.

Other Activity Ideas

KS1:

• Make a painting or collage of part of the assembly story: The disciples fishing, the breakfast on the beach, Jesus forgiving Peter.

KS2:

- Make an Easter Story cube with a different part of the story on each face. Inside the cube put a piece of paper explaining in their own words the meaning of the story for Christians (forgiveness, redemption, salvation).
- Write a letter from Jesus to Peter showing how much he loved him and how he forgave him for what he did and wanted him to go and tell others about Jesus.
- Write a short version of the story of Peter to share with a younger class.
- Create an Acrostic poem about the meaning of Easter to Christians using 'New start'
