#### REFLECTION IDEAS



#### No Room

#### Luke 2:1-20; Matthew 2:1-12

This presentation examines how it can sometimes be difficult to find Jesus in our Christmas celebrations because of all the other things we do at this time of year. However, looking at the Christmas narrative found in the Bible we discover that without Jesus (Christ) there would be no Christmas.

The assembly looks at the ways in which people leave Christ (or Jesus) out of their Christmas. In the puppet sketch one puppet has arranged a surprise party but has forgotten to invite the person whose party it is. There is a sketch, and a song with a mime, which illustrate some of the many reasons that there is no room in many people's Christmases for Jesus, just as there was no room at the inn. The story of the visit of the wise men is shared through a fun chant: these were busy people who did take the time to find Jesus.

## **Questions for reflection**

- What are you looking forward to doing this Christmas? How might you include or remember Jesus in some of those things? Remember, without Jesus' birth there would be no Christmas to celebrate!
- How do you think the puppet felt when they had not been invited to their own birthday party? Do you think Jesus feels sad when we celebrate Christmas without him?


