Here is a snapshot of some activities last term.

Christmas assembly - No Room

Our fun Christmas assembly looked at the ways in which people sometimes



leave Christ out of their Christmas. One of the puppets had arranged a surprise party but had forgotten to invite the other puppet whose birthday it was and a song with a mime illustrated some of the many reasons that there is no room in many people's Christmas for Jesus, just as there was no room at the inn. The children joined in with a chant telling the story of the wise men who, although busy, took time to find Jesus: we encouraged the children to do this too. We are grateful to John Hardwick who put this presentation together many years ago and some lovely emails were received from some of the 125 schools that we visited with their thanks for the assembly.

Inspire Prayer Space Days

Two IPS days were held in the autumn term. The one in November was at a school we last visited in 2022 and had the theme *Me, Others, the Wider World and God.* A variety of tactile and creative activities were used with the one most mentioned by the children afterwards being the *Be Still* activity (a challenge to be still for 2 whole minutes!). The second was a first visit to the school and looked at the story of Jesus' birth and what it means for us today. The children's most mentioned activity for that one was *The Journey*, which encouraged children to look back on their journey through 2024, pausing to reflect and be proud of their achievements in that time. Staff at both schools commented on the calming, reflective atmosphere created allowing space for the children to think, pray (if they wish) and make a connection with God.

The Inspire team have been to Make Lunch Royston five times now, offering the families a chance to explore prayer activities after they have had a hot, healthy meal. The half-

term visit was close to Halloween so we looked at light – how we can be light for others, how Jesus is the light of the world and how light can always drive out darkness!



Team Day

The team day on 30
September was attended by 23 of our volunteers. It started with a time of



worship led by Matt Farley, our regional Scripture Union mission enabler. The main session was led by Amy Robinson who talked about spiritual styles and helped us consider their impact within our ministry. We then had the opportunity to think more about these as we split into four groups and tackled the challenge of re-telling the parable of the Pearl of Great Price (*Matt 13:45-46*) in each of these styles. It was amazing to see the creativity in the room! Amy is a brilliant storyteller and after lunch she inspired us as she shared the story of the widow who asks Elisha for help, from 2 Kings 4. The day also gave us time to reflect in prayer spaces and to connect and chat.


Cool Choices

The space will encourage children to realise that talking about our thoughts and feelings if we are worried, concerned, excited or feeling other emotions is really positive. We ask the questions: What is on your mind today? How are you feeling?

Easter assembly - Choice

The Easter assembly that we plan to take into schools this term begins with some corny egg yolks jokes and a puppet sketch about taking the blame for something someone else did wrong. These are followed by a sketch which imagines how the events of Easter might have been reported on TV in Bible times. The assembly also includes John Hardwick's song that teaches the words of John 3:16, and shares that Christians believe that because of His love for us Jesus chose to take the blame for all the wrong things we have done by dying on the cross. We believe that He then came back to life again and we can choose to acknowledge his sacrifice and follow Him.
